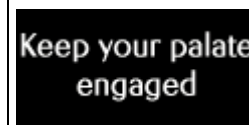
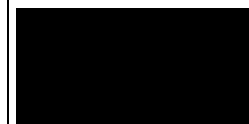

Horrified wine lovers can be assured that Forts de Latour will be available as normal.

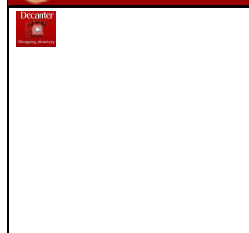
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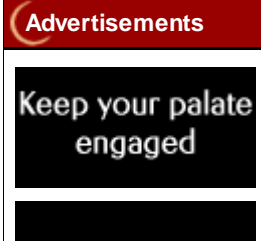


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  What is RSS?
